

**FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR FULL-TIME STUDIES  
AT AUTONOMOUS UNIVERSITIES, SINGAPORE INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY AND  
POLYTECHNICS**

1. The Government is committed to ensuring that no able student is deterred by the costs of post-secondary education in Singapore. It has put in place several assistance schemes to help students at the autonomous universities, Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT) and polytechnics who need some form of financial aid.

2. Details of the schemes are tabulated below. Students can approach the Office of Financial Aid at their respective universities and polytechnics for application forms.

**Notes:**

- The CDC/CCC Bursary and MOE Bursary will be enhanced from AY2014. More details of the enhancements will be released by MOE during the Committee of Supply debate in March 2014.
- Gross monthly household per capita income is defined as the total gross monthly income of immediate and non-immediate family members over the total number of immediate and non-immediate family members.
- All full-time students who are CPF members or dependants of CPF members can also tap on the CPF Education Scheme, which can cover up to 100% of tuition fee.

3. The autonomous universities, SIT and polytechnics also offer their own financial assistance schemes to help needy students. More details on assistance schemes offered by the Government and the institutions can be found at the respective institutions' websites tabulated below.
